



Community College of Philadelphia has signed and returned to the Department of Education the Certification of Agreement and has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004 (a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

What was the total amount of funding Community College of Philadelphia Received?

The total amount of Institutional Funds awarded from the Department of Education in HEERF Funding is \$113,797,174.

What is the total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants Community College of Philadelphia paid?

There were no Emergency Financial Aid Grants issued to Community College of Philadelphia students during the 3rd quarter.

What is the total amount of students Community College of Philadelphia estimates as eligible for Cares Act Funding?

There were no emergency grants issued during the 3rd quarter, however during the 2nd quarter Community College of Philadelphia estimated 10,923 students were eligible for the HEERF III distributions based on the total Spring 2023 semester enrollment.

What is the total amount of students who received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant at Community College of Philadelphia College in Cares Act Funding?

Emergency Financial Aid Grants were not issued during the 3rd quarter. There were a total of 5,266 students who received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant during the 2nd Quarter.

What method did Community College of Philadelphia use to distribute Cares Act Funding?

While CCP did not issue emergency grant funding during the 3rd quarter, in our continued effort to support our students, we are reviewing the remaining funding and working to distribute resources to eligible students during the 4th quarter.

The following method was used to issue Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students during the 2nd quarter:

Community College of Philadelphia issued Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Credit Students, enrolled in classes for Spring 2023 with at least 30 earned credits towards their degree program. Additionally, emergency grant funding was issued to Non-Credit students who were enrolled in our Non-Degree Programs.

The award amount was based on the student's enrollment and is intended as an emergency financial aid grant for any component of the cost of attendance or emergency costs that were presented due to coronavirus, such as: tuition; food; housing; health care (including mental); and childcare.

- \$140 for full-time (12 or more credit hours) Pell Grant recipients

Community College *of* Philadelphia

- \$70 for part-time (11 or less credit hours) Pell Grant recipients
- \$110 for full-time (12 or more credit hours) non-Pell Grant recipients and noncredit students
- \$55 for part-time (11 or less credit hours) non-Pell Grant recipients and noncredit students
