Re: June 30, 2021 Report on HEERF I and II Act Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students

Dear Secretary Cardona,

On April 13, 2020, the Community College of Philadelphia ("the College") signed the Recipient's Funding Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act or HEERF I ("Certification"). This Certification relates to the student portion of the funding in the amount of \$8,051,216 which the College was pleased to receive to assist students that have incurred expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to COVID-19.

On February 9, 2021, the Community College of Philadelphia received grant notification of the Student Allocation of Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund Reporting (HEERF II) – Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) Grant #P425E200794 – 20A. This notification relates to the student portion of the funding in the amount of \$8,051,216.

In accordance with Section 18004(e) of the CARES Act, the College is required to submit a report to the United States Department of Education within thirty (30) days of signing the Certification and every forty-five (45) days through August, and then quarterly thereafter on: (1) how grants were distributed to the students, (2) the amount of each grant awarded to each student; (3) how the amount of each grant was calculated, and (4) any instructions or directions given to students about the grants.

On May 6, 2020, the United States Department of Education issued new guidance directing institutions to post certain information on the College's primary website detailing the following:

- 1) An acknowledgement that the College has signed and returned the Certification, and assurance that the College has used or intends to use no less than 50% of the funds for student grants;
- The total amount of CARES Act funding that the College will receive or has received pursuant to the College's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students;

- 3) The total amount of grants distributed to students under 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of the date of the College's submission/posting (i.e., 30 days after receiving allocation, and every 45 days thereafter);
- 4) The estimated total number of students at the College eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV;
- 5) Total number of students who have received a grant under 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act;
- 6) The method(s) the College used to determine which students receive grants, and how much they would receive; and
- 7) Any instructions, directions, or guidance provided by the College to students concerning the Emergency Financial Aid Grants.

The College received the student aid portion of its funding under the CARES Act on April 21, 2020 and posted all of the above information on the College's website at https://maccollege/sources/sourc

The College has and will continue to update its website quarterly with this information. The information in this letter has been posted. The next posting will be on or before July 7, 2021.

As of June 30, 2021, with regards to the HEERF I Student Grant, the College estimated that 10,516 students at the College were eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV for Spring 2021 of which 8,324 were identified as HEERF I Student Grant eligible. \$8,051,216 of the HEERF I Student Grant funds have been distributed directly to students via check or direct deposit. The College has distributed grants of at least \$500 to 5,809 students. In attachment A, we have provided the individual award disbursements per student under 18004(a) (1) of the HEERF I Student Grant to date.

The College used the following parameters to determine which students received HEERF I grants and how much they would receive:

- a. Allowable Maximum Award Amount per Expense Category:
 - i. Books and Supplies: \$500-750
 - ii. Transportation: \$500 \$750 (based on monthly transpass cost of \$100)
 - iii. Food: \$1,500
 - iv. Housing (rent, utilities, etc.): \$1,000
 - v. Healthcare: \$1,000
 - vi. Childcare: \$750

As of June 30, 2021, with regards to the HEERF II Student Grant, the College has estimated that 11,626 students at the College were eligible to participate in programs under Section 314(a)(1) of the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSAA), Pub. L. 116-260, are governed by Section 314 of CRRSAA for Spring and Summer 2021 and identified as HEERF II Student Grant eligible. The College has distributed \$4,022,400 of the HEERF II Student Grant funds directly to students via check or direct deposit. 3,213 students have received grants of at least \$100. In attachment A, we have provided the individual award disbursements per student under 18004(a)(1) of the HEERF II Student Grant to date. The College used the following parameters to determine which students received HEERF II grants and how much they would receive:

- a. For the Spring 2021 Semester Credit Students:
 - i. Full-Time Enrolled Students with Pell eligible EFC \$2000
 - ii. Full-Time Dual Enrollment Students or Enrolled Students with non-Pell EFC (includes non-financial aid) \$1500
 - iii. Part-Time Enrolled Students with Pell eligible EFC \$1000
 - iv. Part-Time Dual Enrollment Students or Enrolled Students with non-Pell EFC (includes non-financial aid) \$500¹
- b. For Summer I and II Terms 2021 Credit Students
 - i. Full-Time Enrolled Students with Pell eligible EFC \$2000
 - ii. Full-Time Dual Enrollment Students or Enrolled Students with non-Pell EFC (includes non-financial aid) \$1500
 - iii. Part-Time Enrolled Students with Pell eligible EFC \$1000
 - iv. Part-Time Dual Enrollment Students or Enrolled Students with non-Pell EFC (includes non-financial aid) \$500

Full-Time in Summer I and II means 12 credits across both terms

¹ 26 students who had urgent financial needs and were in danger of being dropped from the Spring 2021 semester were awarded student financial aid grants ranging from \$100 to \$1000 for a total of \$14,800. These grants are included in attachment A.



The College has opened up HEERF II grants to non-credits students on June 30, 2021 and intends to open HEERF II grants to non-citizens and international students in its Summer II applications, but no awards for these populations have been distributed to date.
